Thematic Teaching

An introduction to content-based language teaching

What is thematic teaching?

- Lesson is designed around content, not the textbook
- Focus on meaning and communication, not grammar or structure
- Meaningful themes provide a starting point for instruction

How to build a thematic lesson?

- 1. Select the content area
- 2. Select topics to talk about
- 3. Identify functional language outcomes
- 4. Develop the language content
- 5. Choose learning activities

Learning Activities (games, worksheets, presentations, etc)		
Warmup: "Listening to pictures." Teacher shows photos of a vacation. Narrate the pictures, ask questions about location, activities, people in the pictures, etc. This warmup will get the students accustomed to listening to English, present some key vocabulary and language forms, and set the stage for the lesson.		
In a jigsaw exercise, students will re-assemble a mixed-up narration of a vacation.		
Students will interview each other about upcoming travel plans (real or imaginary).		
Students will pretend that they are on vacation, and write a postcard describing their trip.
